

## Third Transmitter For Kununurra

Good news! A third 100kw transmitter is on its way from Elkhart in the USA and is expected to be delivered in March 2016. Our opportunity to share the good news just got better.

It is expected the first broadcast using our newly refurbished transmitter will air in the first half of 2016. This will give Reach Beyond Australia added transmission capacity as well as greater flexibility to deliver programs at the best listening times.

Many of you will be aware of our DRM project. It consisted of refurbishing and modifying

an existing HC 100 transmitter plus upgrading it for digital shortwave operation. The refurbishment is complete; however, the digital technology that is required has not progressed to the extent expected and is still at least 2 years away. Significant distribution of digital receivers across Asia is also well behind schedule. This has helped in our decision to bring the transmitter to Kununurra as soon as possible.

Derek Kickbush, Reach Beyond Media Manager said, "We're not dismissing a move to digital shortwave. It just means it will be later rather than sooner.

What is evident is the need for our third transmitter ...NOW!

We have a great opportunity to enhance our reach into India and the arrival of a third fully refurbished analogue transmitter will greatly assist that. That's the mandate God has given us, to reach the unreached with a message of hope."

Our goal has always been to get the gospel out to as many people that will have ears to hear. In Mark 4:9 it says 'And He said to them, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!"' The response below, sent from Dehradun, Uttarkhand, in Northern India was received only recently and is one of hundreds we are receiving each month.

"I am happy for the good programs that you make. The programs about Jesus asking to forgive your brother 70 times 7 helped me to forgive my brother who cheated me. God bless you for the good programs you make."

Come next March we trust our third transmitter will be added to the fray!

## Light Up a Village

Christopher and Dolly Kirubakaran, our partners in India, are continuing to manage the installation of the 'light up a village' packs into villages throughout Chhattisgarh. We have just received the latest report, following a long and arduous trip, that more villages now have solar panels, LED lights and shortwave radios. 35 villages have now been 'lit up' and can tune into Reach Beyond's shortwave radio programs.

They wrote: *"By God's grace we were able to install Solar Panels and lights, a joy and heart-warming it was to see and meet people that have committed lives to the Lord in just the past few months praising and worshipping God and testifying to how their lives, families and the community is being blessed and changed."*

## Nepal Relief Appeal

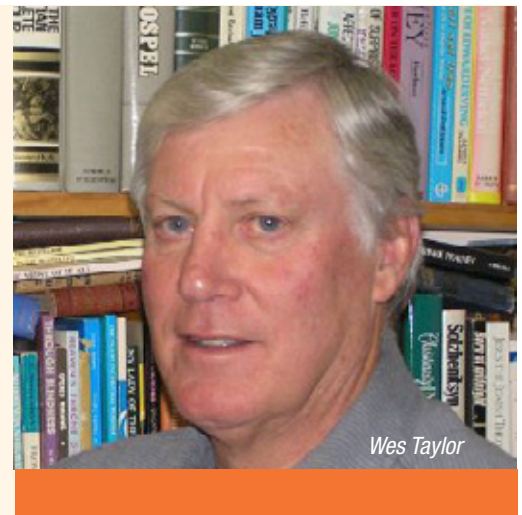
## Farewell to Board Chairman, Wes Taylor

We thank God that the new antennas have added so much strength to the reach of our programs in India this year, and with the arrival of the third transmitter in 2016 we are uniquely placed to reach even more people with the gospel. These include Chhattisgarhi and Kuruk which have been part of our Light up a Village Project in central India, helping to improve the lives of hundreds of families through the installation of solar powered lights and shortwave radios.

Last month we also highlighted three important Indian languages that we are hoping to develop and expand. They are Urdu, Punjabi and Bengali. As you may recall, there is a combined total of 145 million people that speak these languages as 'their first' language in India. That's more than six times Australia's entire population! It's hard to comprehend isn't it?

We prayerfully set a target of \$75,000 to help us achieve this goal. I am excited to share with you that \$15,000 has already been received. Praise God, only \$60,000 to go!

I am grateful for the many people who stand with us in prayer and financially giving, and ask that you continue to pray with us that the Lord will provide what we need so that others might know Jesus.
