Dale strengthened Reach Beyond in ways both visible and unseen — bringing transparency to our finances and careful stewardship to the resources you've entrusted to us, while never wavering from the heart of our mission: sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with the most remote and difficult-to-reach people on earth. But what defined his leadership most was how he led: with a servant's heart, always bringing people to the table, always caring for the team.

Under his watch, partnerships flourished — bringing the Gospel to many people groups across the region in their heart language, including the Chin Matu, Rohingya, and Bhutanese peoples. The listener testimonies we've shared over the years are fruit of this work, sustained by partners like you.

The Board is committed to a prayerful succession. The foundation is strong; the mission unchanged. God has been faithful to Reach Beyond for over ninety years, and we trust Him through this transition.

Dale will remain CEO until September 30 and then stay on staff until the end of the year to assist the incoming CEO.

Dear Friends,

The Board has shared the news letting you know that I am stepping down from the role of CEO, and I wanted to take a moment to add my own thoughts. After 17 years, the time has come for me to pass the baton. It is a little daunting to say out loud, but I know the time is right.

I have been reminded that succession is deeply biblical. It is the pattern of faithful ministry across the generations. The next leader will not simply maintain what we have built; they will add their own God-given shape to it, which I think is exactly as it should be.

I have also heard a heartfelt concern: that whoever leads next must hold the line. That we never drift into vague, comfortable messaging, but remain clear and unashamed in proclaiming the Gospel to the unreached. I share that conviction. It is the whole reason Reach Beyond exists, and it is one thing I would ask you to pray over as the Board seeks new leadership.

I am not retiring though — I don't know exactly what comes next, but I know the One who does, and I am looking forward to finding out.

I am incredibly fortunate to work with a terrific team of people along with a very supportive and encouraging Board of Directors. It's partly because of this that I feel I can step down at this time.

I will continue as CEO through to the end of September and remain on staff until year's end to support whoever the Lord brings to lead Reach Beyond into the future. The foundation is strong. The mission is unchanged. It is simply time.

Finally, a personal thank you. Your kindness, encouragement, and faithfulness over these years have meant a lot. Ministry is never a solo endeavour, and it is incredibly comforting to know you have the prayer and support of so many. Thank you.

A Conversation that Changed Everything

We have been working closely with TWR (Trans World Radio) for many years, united by a heart to reach the unreached. I have always believed that relationships are everything, and we are truly blessed by the strong bond we share with TWR.

Of course, Jesus himself provides the model for relationships. One of my favourite images from the Gospel of John is Jesus cooking fish on the fire. “Come and have breakfast,” he called to the disciples. It’s a simple, beautiful picture — the God of the universe, tending a fire and feeding his friends.

That spirit of partnership has shaped everything Reach Beyond and TWR have built together. Over the years, we have established agreements to support each other should our broadcast sites go off air for any reason. TWR is also a longstanding broadcast partner, with its highly regarded *Women of Hope* program airing from our Kununurra site for a number of years.

So when I spoke with TWR’s Chief Technology Officer, Joe Barker, in Sri Lanka last year about the closure of their Guam shortwave site, I had no idea where the conversation would lead. What began as a discussion soon became an extraordinary opportunity — and before long, our Kununurra Manager, Nic de Vries, along with volunteers Peter Taylor and Greg Cunningham, were on their way to Guam for an intense three weeks across November and December.

Joe was offering us the chance to retrieve vital broadcast assets from their Guam site that could serve our Kununurra Broadcast site for years to come. In his own words:

“Dale, it was a pleasure to see you in Sri Lanka, and discuss how Reach Beyond can make use of the Kingdom resource of the HC100 and parts supply to be decommissioned at KTWR. I look forward to these parts being entrusted to the hands of your team for future Kingdom use. Thank you.”

The team dismantled and carefully packed an HC100 transmitter — one of the original transmitters built by HCJB — along with hundreds of other vital components, loading everything into a sea container, heading towards the port of Darwin.

I am excited to see how God continues to weave TWR and Reach Beyond together in His work.

As you know, I don’t often highlight our financial needs. But a number of our friends have encouraged me to share this story with you and give you an opportunity to be part of it.

The value of these assets is remarkable. Many of the parts simply cannot be purchased — they would have had to be manufactured from scratch. Having them gives us the confidence to maintain our transmitters for years, keeping the gospel on the air for those who need it most. That value far outweighs the cost of bringing them home.

A Son Healed, A Heart Transformed

India

Life changed suddenly for Kumaravel when his eight-year-old son was admitted to hospital. His sickness had progressed to such a severe stage that doctors had lost hope.

“They told us it was impossible to save him,” Kumaravel told Reach Beyond. “Hearing those words shattered my heart. As a parent, nothing prepares you for such a moment.”

While sitting beside his son’s hospital bed, waiting, watching, and helpless, Kumaravel turned to the pages of the *Fresh* devotional which is distributed to more than 60,000 people across India, in the Tamil language, via messaging platform WhatsApp.

Kumaravel says he had been reading it on and off, but in despair, he started over.

“I began reading the devotionals again — one by one,” he said. “This time, the words were no longer just sentences on a page. They became life to me. They spoke directly into my pain, my fear, and my brokenness.”

Kumaravel says he eventually walked into the hospital chapel and with tears in his eyes issued an emotional prayer.

“Lord, if You truly love me as I have been reading, please forgive me. Please heal my son. He is so precious to me. I place him in Your hands.”

Even after his plea to God, doctors repeated their concerns — there was no hope.

“I felt crushed,” Kumaravel said. “I went home in deep sadness, confused and weary, wondering why I had prayed in faith only to hear such devastating words.”

But God was at work.

“Three days later, we began noticing small signs of improvement. What seemed impossible, started becoming possible. Day-by-day, strength returned to my son’s body. Thirty days later, he had completely recovered.”

“The same doctors who had given up were now witnessing a miracle. I know with all my heart — this was purely the hand of God. This was the mercy and power of our Lord. The One who says nothing is impossible.”

“Through this trial, I did not only see my son healed — I saw my own heart transformed. The Lord did not give up on me. He met me in my doubt. He answered me in my weakness. He revealed Himself to me in my desperation.”

“Today, I am baptised. My family and I go to church regularly. Our faith is no longer uncertain — it is rooted in experience. We have seen the faithfulness of Jesus Christ in our own lives.”

Like many people, as they are introduced to Christ, the simple act of reading a daily devotional can result in a life-changing encounter.

Later, as I listened, I became more and more interested in the messages. Now God's salvation and the Word of the Lord have taken over my life completely. This is because the songs, sermons and other programs broadcast on the HA are effective and relevant, in line with the current situation in my native place.
